Sixty-five percent of the voters in yesterday's A.M.S. referendum said yes: change the eligibility clause. The referendum needed 66 and two thirds percent in order to go through. Of the 4,154 voters, 2,698 were for the revision of the presidential clause, and 1456 were against. In Fort Camp, 60 voted for and 34 against in the advance poll. Though the referendum was not the closest in UBC history, the Yes vote was only 71 short of the two-thirds mark. The Engineering, MacMillan, Memorial Gym, and Woodward Library Buildings were the only ones in which the majority voted No.

Returning Officer Chuck Campbell said the turnout was good. Vice-President elect Carey Linde commented: "I ran for Vice-President so that I could be involved in a government with a fresh approach that would have somebody with the talents of Stan Persky as president. Since he will not be on the council, the obligation is obviously upon me to give serious consideration to running for the office that he wasn't able to compete for."
