FOR PRESIDENT:

Paul Barnett

As President, I would propose:

- to continue to deal with Housing in the same reasonable, responsible manner which has prevailed during the four years I have lived at Fort Camp.
- to consolidate the gains made this year (Visiting Hours, Standards Committee, etc.) and to strive for more freedom and autonomy (sic) for Fort Camp
