BARNETT, MCLACHLIN, & NIGHTINGALE LOSE ELECTION

A Democratic (?) Election - by Michael Quigley

Do you remember back in high school elections when they used to announce only the results, rather than the actual numbers of votes cast for each candidate, for fear of "hurting someone"? That was back in high school. It is interesting to note that this type of procedure is still being followed at the university level - namely, after last Monday's Fort Camp Men's Council elections.

When I asked Men's Council President Jens Pedersen if I would be allowed to have the numerical results of votes for publication in the Fort Camp News and possibly the Ubysey, he stated, "We'll only give out the winner. We live in a small residence and it would be embarrassing for the low man." Vice-President Gordon Leifler added, "Once you've got a winner, that's all you need. Nobody feels badly about it."

The suggestion that the results would be embarrassing for the low man seems rather questionable in light of the fact that I personally asked each of the six candidates if I could publish the figures, and none of these candidates had any objections to my doing so. Further complicating this matter is the fact that after the ballot counting, the six candidates' scrutineers, supposedly acting in their candidates' interests, voted not to release the figures.

As well, I am seriously led to question why the results would be embarrassing. These elections aren't, I hope, personality contests, and, as in the recent election, if the candidates go out and campaign rather than rely solely on the support of their friends, there should be a reasonable and fair distribution of votes.

The answer to this problem was suggested to me Monday night by Gordon Leifler, who hinted that there might be some Constitutional changes initiated regarding the releasing of election figures. In relation to this change, there are at least two points worthy of consideration.

First, the changing of the vague terminology in the clause which mentions "results". ("The Returning Officer shall post the names of the successful candidates immediately after the results are officially declared.") "Results" has about as much meaning here as "counting the ballots" did in the recent A.M.S. election.

Secondly, there is a clause which states "Any candidate shall be entitled to demand a recount." This seems rather difficult in view of the decision not to release the figures. As well, I was informed by Gordon Leifler that it was the function of the scrutineers to ask for a recount. Well, that's not what it says in the Constitution.

Perhaps it would be wise to set up a committee to investigate Constitutional irregularities such as these and help rid Fort Camp of its high school "democracy", the existence of which seems rather ironic in view of Housing's comments about the "maturity and responsible leadership" of our Men's Council.
