Thunderbird Arena was the scene on Sunday night of a hockey game between the Fort Camp and Lower Mall teams. Tension ran high before the game, as vicious rumors had been circulated that Lower Mall had bolstered the strength of their team with several players who were not in residence there. As the teams took to the ice, to the roars of the Fort Camp supporters, it became evident that these stories were, indeed, true, as a reliable source identified two players as off-campus students. Lower Mall opened the scoring with a quick goal in the first minute of play. Gerry Sarich retaliated immediately with a beautiful slap-shot
